Annual Meeting Day:

The Annual Meeting Day is this Friday, October 26th. It is a full day of activities, including sessions discussing the workplace and where the direction of the architecture profession is headed, as well as our annual meeting and town hall meeting. The registration fee is minimal for members and Fanning Howey, Lott3 Metz Architecture, LLC, Stucky+Vitale Architects and Tiseo Architects, Inc have generously offered to pay for the AIA Associate and AIAS member registration fees, so I highly encourage our Associates and AIAS members to take advantage of this opportunity. To give you a better idea of what to expect at Annual Meeting Day, I have been showcasing a program from the event schedule in each Monday Minutes leading up to the meeting day. This week I am featuring the three different tour options available on Friday morning:

1- Walking Tour of Downtown Lansing Architecture: This program presents a historical perspective on Lansing Architecture and includes ten sites located in the downtown district. Examples range from 1850-2002 and represent key

architectural styles and adaptive reuse projects. Docents at each location will provide participants with a synopsis of relevant information, and group guides will highlight additional points of interest AIA members can visit on their own at a later date.

2- Tour of the State Capitol

This tour will be led by a member of the Capitol Tour & Information Service and the architect of the restoration project. Tour attendees will learn about the original construction of the building, Elijah Myers's design philosophy and approach to public buildings, along with the process of marrying technology into the building during the restoration phase.

3- Tour of the Mutual Building

This tour will be led by representatives from the Christman Company. Restored and rededicated in 2008, the facility is the world's first "Triple Platinum" LEED certified building. Participants will learn about the historic rehabilitation of the building, sustainable design principles and LEED design process.
