Architects, Engineers, Surveyors Join Forces for Legislative Meeting

March 5, 2014 - Lansing, Michigan - The architect members of the Michigan component of the American Institute of Architects (AIA) will join forces with engineer and surveyor groups for the annual Legislative Day at the State Capitol today in Lansing, Michigan. The Architects, Engineers & Surveyors Legislative Committee (AESLC) utilize this annual event to promote education on the current industry issues, meet with Michigan's Representatives and Senators, and express the profession's interests and concerns.

The AESLC partners are: AIA Michigan, American Council of Engineering Companies (ACEC), Michigan Society of Professional Surveyors (MSPS) and Michigan Society of Professional Engineers (MSPE). Each organization holds four voting members and the combined council meets on a regular basis to discuss legislative issues facing the building industry.

Legislative Day promotes fellowship across multi-disciplinary facets of the building industry. In the midst of rebuilding Michigan's economy, these groups rally to offer their expertise to the Legislature and wish to use their skills to rebuild a strong, vibrant Michigan. The AESLC maintains that an effective approach to government affairs requires relationship building, visibility, awareness and vigilance.

Legislative Day attendees are provided with information, instruction, and partners for visiting with the legislators. Members meet with their Legislators throughout the morning and afternoon and are able to converse with Legislators additionally during a lunch hosted by the AESLC.
